HOW STRONG IS OUR FAITH?

Today's account (Mark 4:35-41) of Jesus calming the storm at sea demonstrates Mark's unique ability to tell a succinct and profound story. We will understand it better by standing alongside Mark's original audience as we hear it. Mark wrote for a community that was in distress because Christ's second coming had not yet occurred, and instead of the great and final victory of God, they were undergoing persecution and witnessing the martyrdom of their leaders. There was also the great struggle of combining Jews and gentiles in the new Christian community. In Mark's day, Christian life was far from calm.

As Mark sets this scene, Jesus has been preaching in parables and explaining the details to his disciples. Then he makes the odd suggestion that he and the in-group cross over to foreign territory. We don't hear any reaction from the disciples, but the trip turned out to be far more harrowing than they expected. While the hurricane-like storm threatened to engulf them, most disturbing of all was the fact that Jesus, far from sharing their distress, was peacefully napping. With a reproachful tone, they awakened Jesus with the accusation that their safety meant nothing to him.

Jesus made no reply to their indictment. Instead, using the language of exorcism, he "rebuked" the storm and ordered the waves to settle down. Wind and water immediately obeyed his command. Seeing that, the disciples were more frightened by his power than they had been by the storm itself. They must have been hoping that he would lend a hand, or at least be conscious with them as they breathed their last. But Jesus addressed the storm itself. That shifted their attention from themselves and the boat to him. Once he had controlled the tempest, Jesus took up his own reproach. The disciples accused him of not being concerned about them, while Jesus chided them for failing to have faith in the God whose reign was appearing in their midst.

We ought not be too hard on the disciples. With good reason, they wanted some sign that Jesus was with them in their terrifying crossing. What they didn't expect was a show of care that revealed him to be as much at one with the Creator as with creation. Their question "Who then is this?" could not have been more genuine, and no other question could have provided more fertile ground for faith. They were overwhelmed and yet willing to venture further in their understanding. Today's Gospel invites us to stand with the disciples, asking, "Who is our God?" and "How strong is our faith?"

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

Dear Friends,

This Sunday, on the Church calendar, is the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time. On our nation's calendar, we celebrate Father's Day. A woman gave birth to "Father's Day." In 1908, Grace Clayton organized the first celebration in Fairmont, West Virginia. She wanted to honor 210 fathers who had died earlier in a mining disaster. Two years later in Spokane, another woman, Sonora Smart Dodd, promoted the celebration of Father's Day. She believed there should be a complement to Mother's Day. Her father, William Jackson Smart, was a single parent who had raised six children. She chose June, the month of her father's birthday, for Father's Day. It is Mrs. Dodd's celebration that quickly caught on in the United States and around the world.

Despite the support of several Presidents, Congress twice defeated proposals to elevate Father's Day to the status of a national holiday. Only in 1966 did President Johnson issue the first presidential proclamation designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Congress finally passed a resolution in 1972 making it a permanent national holiday which President Nixon signed into law.

Father's Day always falls in "Ordinary Time." "Ordinary Time" strikes me as the perfect season to celebrate Father's Day. Much of what is expected of good and caring Dads might be considered ordinary or routine. Good Dads mow the lawn, change the light bulbs, stack the wood by the fireplace, coach little league, get the family to Mass, grill the burgers and dogs, and wash the car. Good Dads teach their children life's most important lessons by loving and respecting their wives in everyday, ordinary ways. Like many of you, I was blessed with an ordinary Dad.

Along with the entire parish staff and my Augustinian brothers, I wish a Happy Father's Day to all our Dads. We pray that your day is extraordinary.

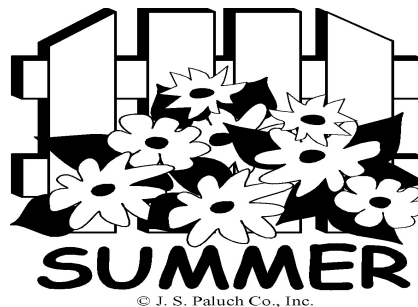

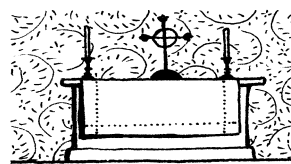
MAIN LINE SINGLES DINNER CLUB
