LOVE IS ITS OWN REWARD

In today's Gospel (Mark 12:38-44), Jesus begins by warning the crowd about some scribes who are clearly ostentatious about their religious authority, parading in long robes, accepting greetings and places of honor in both synagogues and banquets. The scribes were people who studied Torah and were able to discuss and interpret it for the people. They were the learned men who were supposed to know what God desires of us and follow through on it, while teaching God's ways to others. Instead, Jesus says, they "devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext, recite lengthy prayers."

Devouring the houses of widows probably refers to widows who, upon the death of their male guardians, entrusted their property to scribes whom they believed to be reputable in protecting their meager belongings. Jesus accuses the scribes of using their religious position to exploit poor, vulnerable and powerless widows. They willfully act contrary to the Torah and to what covenant relationship demands.

Mark now shifts the scene to Jesus sitting in the temple opposite the treasury and observing all those who make contributions for the upkeep of the temple. Thirteen trumpet-shaped metal receptacles were available for people to deposit their money. Those who made large contributions made a lot of noise when making their donations, probably attracting the attention of others and leading to pride and ostentation.

As Jesus watches, a poor, unnoticed widow puts in two small coins, worth very little. She neither made much noise nor called attention to herself, but she gave all she had to live on. Jesus calls his disciples and points to the widow as a model of true discipleship. Others contributed greatly from their surplus wealth. The widow's contribution is highlighted by the repetition of three phrases: "From her poverty...all she had...her whole livelihood."

There are many ways that scholars have interpreted this scene. The first is the message of giving our all, of showing total and true generosity out of religious dedication and devotion to God. Jesus is praising the widow for her willingness to risk and give totally of herself. Others see the widow as someone religiously abused by temple authorities who promised to use the money to care for the poor, but instead used it for their own purposes. In this interpretation, Jesus is lamenting the way the temple structure is actually abusing and oppressing the needy for the authorities' own selfish purposes.

Maybe both interpretations have some truth to them. What we do know is that Mark's Jesus will soon be giving of himself completely in his passion and death so that others may live. Jesus, like the widow, and like all disciples worthy of the name, are to be willing to give of themselves totally and completely so that others may have life.

Dear Friends,

This past Sunday, we held our fourth annual New Parishioners Brunch. All those who have registered as parishioners over the past two years were invited to join in the festive First Sunday brunch sponsored monthly by the Religious Education program. After the 11:15 Mass, 172 of us gathered in the Gymnasium. A wonderful spirit filled the room. There was lots of lively conversation and laughter as people from different towns, states and countries got to know each other now as members of the same parish. Those gathered ranged in age from a newborn soon to be baptized here to new recruits for our parish Senior group. Some had moved only a few miles before joining the parish. Others had moved over one thousand miles.

I was told repeatedly by the new parishioners how welcome they were made to feel by those already in the pews. The words "warm" and "friendly" kept being repeated as they described their initial experiences with the "veterans" of the parish. Well done, my friends. What wonderful testimony to our efforts to be a welcoming community.

Every year, I share with the group an interesting statistic about our parish. The overall number of people who belong to the parish (1,050 households) has been constant for fifteen years. Yet, every two years over 100 families register as new parishioners. That means that, at any given time, 10% of the parish has been here for less than two years. It would appear that although many in the parish have been members for a long time, some even for their whole lives, a significant number of those in our pews are always new.
