WHAT AM I/ARE WE TO DO?

“What ought we to do?” This question appears three times in today’s Gospel (Luke 3:10-18). In each instance, the query reflected the questioner’s desire for salvation and functioned as a key, opening the way to further revelation and challenging listeners to believe. Such a question should be often on the lips of Advent believers who are eager to be renewed in the spirit and mind of the coming Christ. To the crowds who asked, as well as to the soldiers and tax collectors, John the Baptist’s answers stood as challenges to conversion such that they would no longer live solely for themselves but for others and for God. In this way would the kingdom Jesus had come to proclaim begin to exist here among all of humankind.

In the second half of today’s Gospel, we learn that the person and the preaching of John were so compelling that many wondered if he was the Christ. John’s contemporaries were eagerly awaiting an anointed one who would reinstate Israel and establish God’s gracious rule over all. While some were of the mind that John would figure very importantly in this process, Luke left no doubt that John was preparing for “one mightier” who had yet to appear. In Jewish literature, the term “mighty” was often used in reference to the one who would lead the people in their final struggle with evil. In preparation for the mightier one, John had baptized with water, but Jesus would bring a bath of fire and Spirit.

The “winnowing fan,” used to separate wheat from chaff, is an apt symbol of the process of judgment between good fruit and the fruitless at the end time. No doubt the crowds, tax collectors and soldiers were sobered by John’s references to this symbol of judgment. He, like any avid preacher of God’s good news, surely hoped that this sober moment would urge his listeners to action, to repentance, to reconciliation, to good deeds.

Today, the living word of this Gospel has lost none of its power. Just as on the day they were first spoken, John’s good and graced words empower believers to ask the right and courageous question “What ought we to do?” and then work toward an honest answer so as to prepare a worthy welcome for our coming and ever-present God.

ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE

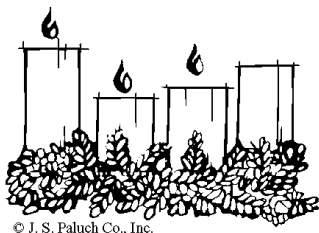
Dear Friends,

This coming Tuesday, December 15th at 7:30pm, we will celebrate our Advent Communal Penance Service. All are welcome. The individual celebration of Confession is available every Saturday morning in our church. But, twice a year, once in Advent and once in Lent, we have a communal celebration of the sacrament. On Tuesday night, I will preside at the brief gathering ritual and offer a few thoughts to assist our examinations of conscience. Five or six Augustinian confessors will be present. After our communal prayer, we Augustinians will spread out around the church. Those who so desire will then approach the confessor of their choice to celebrate the great sacrament of God's mercy.

It may have been some time since you last celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation, that is, "gone to Confession." Perhaps, you have never considered, as an adult, the healing, healthy and necessary role of reconciliation in all of our lives. Like many of us, I generally refer to the sacrament as "Confession" or "Penance." It's important, however, to remember that the sacrament's proper name is "Reconciliation." "Confession" puts the sacrament's emphasis incorrectly on our sense of guilt. The sacrament is all about God's love and mercy. Reconciliation comes from the Latin word meaning, "to be at peace again." What a worthy notion – "to be at peace again."

This Tuesday evening, the Sacrament of Reconciliation invites us "to be at peace again." To be at peace with ourselves, to be at peace with others, to be at peace with God – what a wonderful way to prepare ourselves to celebrate Christmas.

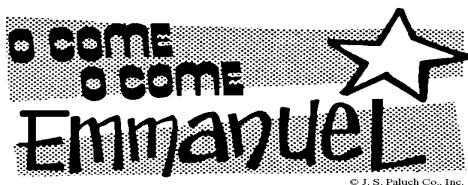
From the Browse Around Thriftshop

ADVENT HYMN

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

and

The “O Antiphons” of Advent

Well-known Advent hymn, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel, is based upon an ancient prayer of the Church, the “O Antiphons,” which have been chanted as far back as the 7th century. They are still sung in the days leading up to Christmas, December 17-23, as antiphons at Evening Prayer. The hymn-tune first appeared in English print in 1854. It was copied from a small 15th century French service book, under the title “Bone Iesu, dulcis cunctis,” where it was actually sung as a litany for a funeral processional! We have come to know and love this as an Advent melody of longing and hope as we await the birth of Christ. Why not incorporate the seven verses of this hymn in your nightly prayer, united with the universal church in anticipation of our coming Savior. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you!

(Pray the stanzas of this hymn from the Breaking Bread Music Issue the next time you arrive at church. You will be imploring Christ as: Emmanuel, Wisdom from on high, Great Lord of might, Rod of Jesse’s stem, Key of David, Dayspring from on high, and Desire of nations.)

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Began December 8, 2015

Pope Francis chose to inaugurate the *Jubilee Year of Mercy* last Tuesday because December 8th marks the fiftieth anniversary of the closing of Vatican II. That council, Pope Francis reminds us, inaugurated a new phase in the Church’s history. The Spirit called the Church to tear down the walls that for far too long had made it a fortress, and to proclaim the gospel in a new, more accessible way. Pope Francis quotes St. John XXIII in declaring the Church’s preference for “the medicine of mercy,” and Blessed Paul VI in proposing the Good Samaritan as our model for discipleship. Pope Francis adds that God’s mercy is “the beating heart of the Gospel,” and that mercy “must penetrate the heart and mind” of every disciple. Three times, today’s Gospel asks “What should I do?” Pope Francis would say: Imitate Jesus, who came not wielding the fiery judgment that John the Baptist had threatened, but instead imparting healing, compassion, forgiveness – mercy!
