TODAY, I MUST STAY AT YOUR HOUSE

If you received an invitation to have lunch with Pope Francis, what would you wear that day? What questions and comments would you rehearse for the table conversation? How would you react if TV cameras followed you as you walked in? Would you smile and wave, or just keep a serious look on your face?

In today's Gospel (Luke 19:1-10), Zacchaeus' conversation experience came to a climax when Jesus, a guest in his home, announced, "Today, salvation has come to this house." But that experience had begun when Zacchaeus ran ahead and climbed a tree in order to see Jesus. Zacchaeus didn't climb that tree only because he was short. Something about Jesus himself led the tax collector to risk being criticized and humiliated by his contemporaries. Dignified adults in Jesus' day did not run or climb trees, but Zacchaeus' attraction to Jesus was stronger than public opinion. Whatever drew him to Jesus that day forever changed Zacchaeus' life. Attraction led to dialogue, dialogue led to conversion and repentance, for all culminated in Jesus offering Zacchaeus the gift of salvation.

Before receiving that gift, Zacchaeus affirmed his desire to change his life for the better by admitting his wrongdoings and making amends. Zacchaeus willingly accepted one of the requirements Jesus asked of his disciples: to give half of what they owned to the poor. When Jesus asked for similar generosity from a rich young man, also in Luke's Gospel, that man went away sad. In this action, Zacchaeus chose to relinquish the security that his hefty bank account gave him and entrusted himself to God and to Jesus.

Although the final verse of today's Gospel may be a later addition by Luke, it is nevertheless an apt description of Jesus' ministry. He came to seek and save the lost. In the Zacchaeus narrative, it may seem that Zacchaeus was doing the seeking. But Jesus also searched for Zacchaeus, and having gotten his attention, Jesus went to his home, an action that communicated loudly and clearly Jesus' desire to seek and to save. On that day and through his interaction with Jesus, Zacchaeus clearly grew into his name: Zacchaeus means *righteous one*. His experience, his humility, his honest assessment of himself and his willingness to *go out on a limb* to respond to God and to grace, challenges each of us to do likewise.

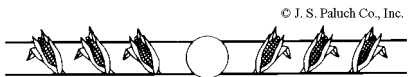
PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

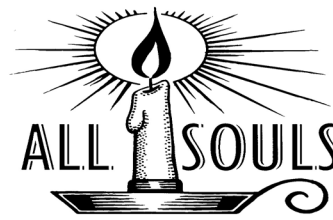
FEAST OF ALL SAINTS

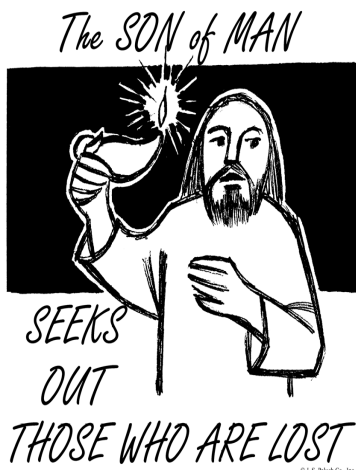

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

December 8, 2015-November 20, 2016

When Pope Francis called for the 2015-2016 church year to be a *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, he challenged us to demonstrate compassion and mercy for those who are suffering pain and poverty and experiencing exclusion. Our parish responded with many actions including many focused on food insecurity, a priority for us for many years. As the conclusion of the Jubilee Year approaches, we are planning ways to expand and sustain these actions.

First, we plan to broaden our many current activities to feed those who are poor. For example, OMGC parishioners donate time and food every other month for the food pantry at St. Cyprian, home of our former sister-parish, Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament. Every other month, we take our food to the Patrician Society in Norristown. We participate in the Manna Food drive annually and deliver that food to the Patrician Society as well. We provide time, food and housing five times a year for families who are temporarily homeless through the Interfaith Hospitality Network. The Archdiocesan Nutritional Development Service counts on our Religious Education Program to hold food drives throughout the year. We can do more.

Second, we plan additional ways to **advocate** for change in policies, programs and systems that allow hunger and poverty to persist. For years OMGC has participated in an annual offering of letters to our nation's decision-makers through Bread for the World (BFW), a Christian, bi-partisan organization. In 2015, the campaign focused on the Global Food Security Act which was passed by Congress earlier in 2016 due in great part to the letter writing campaign. The 2016 campaign focused on funding for actions called for in this act and OMGC sent over 400 letters to our Senators. These campaigns have helped reduce the number of people who experience hunger by over 200 million worldwide (42 million in the US including 13 million children) since 1990, but 795 million remain hungry.

What can you and your family do now? If not already involved, join current activities to feed the poor. Consider joining BFW by visiting their website: www.Bread.org to learn more. Attend an upcoming presentation by Sr. Mary Elizabeth Clark, SSJ on **Wednesday, November 16 at 7:00 p.m.** at

St. Thomas of Villanova Auditorium in Rosemont. Sister will teach us how to **advocate** for change that will reduce incidences of hunger.
